Makerspace to Open the Doors to Creativity

The wait is almost over for makers of all ages to get hands-on in The Forge Makerspace at the Cranberry Public Library.

As the 2019 Cranberry Township Community Chest Project of the Year, renovations within the Library were moving right along, with doors initially set to open in April 2020. Instead, they were slammed shut by the COVID-19 pandemic.

They will officially – finally – open at 5:30 p.m. Thursday, July 29 with a private ribbon cutting ceremony and video presentation.

The Makerspace features a Cricut maker, sewing and embroidery machines, soldering stations, a laser engraver, and several 3D printers. That's in addition to the everyday supplies one needs to make a work of art. Named "The Forge" in honor of the Municipal Center's history, the Makerspace promises a safe, creative space to learn, create, explore and come together with other makers.
