One-Time Credit Offered for Pool Filling

It's almost time to pull back the tarp and grab the bug skimmer to get swimming pools ready for the summer.

The Township offers a one-time credit for the filling of pools to make those summer days a little more relaxing.

Property owners must supply dates of the activity. The Township will review water usage and the credit will be limited to 50 percent of the current sewer rates. Credit requests must be submitted for the current year only.

The credit is only available to pools issued with Cranberry Township Permits and an issued Certificate of Compliance. Customers with a deduct meter are not eligible for this pool credit. It can take up to two billing cycles for the credit to appear on an account.

RAIN IS A GOOD THING

Adjust Irrigation to Account for Wet Weather

April showers are said to bring May flowers – but May is known to bring rainy weather of its own.

Residents are asked to avoid irrigating their lawns and gardens on rainy days. The reason is simple: Mother Nature has already done the work!

It isn't necessary to water lawns and gardens for at least two days after it rains. Watering isn't needed until the top two inches of soil are dry. It is a good idea to irrigate either early in the morning or later in the evening.

Other helpful tips:

- Use a weather-based irrigation controller that account for changing weather, soil conditions, and plant types.
- Set up a rain barrel to harvest rainwater from gutters for watering gardens and landscapes.
- Check sprinkler systems frequently and adjust so only the lawn is watered.



KEEP IT FLOWING

Don't Flush 'Flushable' Wipes

They may be convenient, but flushable wipes can wreak havoc on resident's pipes and the Township's sanitary sewer system.

To keep Cranberry's sanitary sewer system functioning at maximum capacity, residents are reminded to only flush toilet paper.

Disinfecting wipes or other non-flushable items should be disposed of in the trash. While many sanitary wipes purport to be flushable, overuse of those products can have an impact on sanitary sewer systems – including those within a person's home. Fixing these backups is costly and time consuming.

Flushing only toilet paper helps ensure that the toilets, plumbing, sewer systems and septic systems will continue working properly to safely manage wastewater.


