



KEEP IT CLEAR: TOWNSHIP RULES REGARDING SNOW REMOVAL

The Township's Public Works Department is always ready when winter weather hits. But they need your help to work as quickly and efficiently as possible.

Please remember:

- Do not park on Township streets. Vehicles may be ticketed and/towed where there is no street parking signage.
- Follow the 10-foot rule: Keep basketball hoops, snow forts, parked cars in driveways, and non-permanent seasonal items 10 feet from the edge of the street.
- Do not move snow from driveways and sidewalks into the paved street.
- Trim trees so that branches do not extend beyond the back of the curb and a minimum of 14 feet in height.

Taking these steps ensure the safety of Township crews and residents and will help keep streets safe and passable.

TAKE STEPS TO KEEP FOG FREE

It's crystal clear: FOG can cause expensive damage.

When fats, oils and grease - aka FOG - break down, they create a soap-like byproduct that combines with other materials that stick to the walls of pipes. FOG also combines with food, flushable wipes and chemicals to create blockages within the system.

Over time, that material hardens, turning a liquid sludge into a concrete blockage. Nearly half of sewer line backups are caused by FOG, and it can cost thousands to find and remove a blockage. Residents can take the following steps to keep clear of FOG damage:

- Thoroughly scrape plates into the garbage.
- Avoid using garbage disposals that add solids to the wastewater system.
- Never dump grease into the sink.

These small, extra steps can go a long way in ensuring wastewater is flowing free and clear.

The Township's Customer Portal makes monitoring and controlling water usage easier than ever. The Portal is free and available on the Township website and provides real-time water usage data. Consumption is shown in increments of a gallon, compared to thousands of gallons in the previous system. Customers can set usage limits, vacation alerts, and thresholds, which can help detect leaks.
