### FIND FUNKY FUMES? TRY YOUR TRAP!

Does it seem like sewer gas is seeping into your shack? Stop the smell with a simple check of your water traps. Traps are often found under basement floor drains, laundry tubs, wash basins, or other drains located throughout your home.

The trap uses water to create a barrier between sewer gas and your homes living environment. If a drain is not used for an extended period, the water in the trap evaporates. When this happens, sewer gas has easy access to the room, causing smells in the basement and beyond. To remedy this situation, simply pour a pitcher full of fresh water down the smelly drain to restore the barrier and eliminate the smell.

Another cause of odor is the absence or deterioration of the wax seal located under a toilet. A replacement seal can be purchased at local hardware stores and installed by the homeowner or plumber. In addition to getting rid of the stinky smell, taking these steps to eliminate sewer gas creates a healthy home environment for you, your family, and your pets.



### ROTARY DOG PARK TO WELCOME CRANBERRY'S CANINES

The official grand opening of the new Cranberry Township Rotary Dog Park will take place on Saturday, September 24 at 10 a.m.

The expanded and renovated location is adjacent to the original dog parks in Community Park.

The wooded areas border the Community Park trail. The expanded park also offers ample parking, water access, agility obstacles, and benches. A pavilion and concrete pad offer a comfortable area to gather and watch pooches enjoy the open space.
