HYDRANT AND DISTRIBUTION SYSTEM FLUSHING TO BEGIN

Water going down the drain over the next few months is helping keep Cranberry's water supply flowing cleanly.

Hydrant flushing is a routine maintenance operation designed to flush sediment from the water system, check fire hydrant operation, and test chlorine levels in the water lines throughout the Township. Flushing is conducted from 7 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday. Discolored water and fluctuations in water pressure are normal during flushing. The Township suggests that customers refrain from doing laundry when their neighborhood lines are being flushed.

After a reasonable time, if water does not clear, return to normal pressure, or service is interrupted, call Customer Service at 724-776-4806. For a full schedule, visit cranberrytownship.org/flushing or scan the QR code.

GOING YARD: WASTE COLLECTION UNDERWAY

With the first signs of spring sprouting, the sounds of lawnmowers and weed eaters aren't far behind.

The collection of yard waste has resumed and will be picked up on regularly scheduled trash pickup days.

Residents should place yard waste curbside in a green-top cart or biodegradable paper bags. Dirt, stones, litter, and other debris should be removed. Leaves and lawn trimmings in plastic bags will not be collected.

No sticker is necessary during the yard waste collection season.
