

SOAKING UP SUMMER

Get Green Grass, Consider Conservation

As sweltering summer weather rages on, a few steps can be taken to conserve water and ensure lawns remain lush and green.

- Water early in the morning, which ensures more water soaks into the lawn or garden. Less water will evaporate during morning waterings.
- If using a sprinkler system, set a timer and ensure it is in good working order.
- Fix leaking spigots and occasionally check for leaks in hoses and lines.
- Use a rain barrel or other system to recycle rainwater.
- Use landscaping, mulch, and flower beds to keep water within the soil.
- Use a broom or leaf blower to clear debris instead of a hose.
- Cut grass on a higher mower setting. This allows the grass to grow deeper roots and become more resilient.
- Sharpen mower blades, as a dull blade tears grass and creates ragged edges that lose moisture
- A test for checking if the lawn needs water: Step on it. If the grass springs back, it doesn't need watered.
- Keep an eye out for discoloration, curling or wilting of grass, as these indicate heat stress
- Use a screwdriver to test soil moisture. Ideal soil saturation is 6-8 inches deep.
- Place a 1-inch-deep tuna can on the lawn to measure the amount of water used. When the can is full, shut off sprinklers for the day.

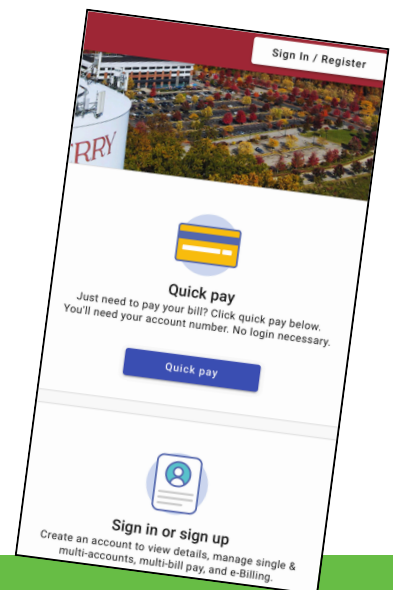


Give Us Some Space!
